ALBERTA'S RELAUNCH STRATEGY: STAGE 2

Effective June 22nd, 2020, the *Government of Alberta*'s "<u>Opening Soon - Alberta's</u> <u>Relaunch Strategy</u>" document has been updated to reflect which businesses are able to reopen during Stage 2 and what public health measures must be followed. In addition, Alberta Biz Connect has updated their website to include a variety of <u>relaunch</u> <u>workplace guidance documents</u> as a method to help businesses reopen and resume operations safely.

The *Government of Alberta* announced on June 29th, Alberta's Recovery Plan and will start accepting applications for the \$5,000 Small and Medium Enterprise Relaunch Grant.

→ <u>ALBERTA'S RECOVERY PLAN: CREATING JOBS, BUILDING,</u>

DIVERSIFYING - The *Government of Alberta* has developed details regarding the province's economic strategy, which includes a record \$10-billion investment in infrastructure and a plan for 50,000 jobs this year.

→ <u>SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISE RELAUNCH</u> - Starting on June 29th, the *Government of Alberta* will allow small and medium-sized businesses, co-ops and

non-profits that have 500 or fewer employees to apply for funding of up to \$5,000 in order to help open doors and have employees return back to work. These funds will help businesses purchase non-medical PPE, as well as to help pay their wages, rent, and other supplies that are needed in order to continue to reopen or operate safely. Businesses in Spruce Grove can apply on Tuesday June 30th, 2020.

→ <u>Bill 23: Commercial Tenancies Protection Act</u> - The *Government of Alberta* has introduced Bill 23 to provide protection for commercial tenants and businesses in Alberta to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic as a method to help restart the economy. As a result, these new measures aim to help address any gaps from the Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance (CECRA) program.

→ <u>Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance (CECRA)</u> - The *Canada Mortgage* and Housing Corporation has made changes to the CECRA program. Eligible commercial property owners will receive unsecured, interest-free, and forgivable loans for the sole purposes of reducing monthly rent by 75% at minimum owed by impacted small business tenants and to assist in the payment of operating expenses incurred by the owner. All loans granted pursuant to CECRA will be forgiven on December 31st, 2020, given that property owners comply with the requirements of the program.

→ Industry Insights: Consumer Series - The International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) conducted a survey that reveals that Canadians are ready for in-store shopping as businesses reopen post COVID-19 with a cautious approach. As a result, the top venues missed by consumers were:
