COUNTRY STONE DISTILLERY & INTENSITY VR









Country Stone Distillery

Located at #138, 485 South Avenue, <u>Country Stone Distillery</u> is Spruce Grove's first local distiller. Using a sugar cane base and locally sourced ingredients, owner Dwayne

Bizeau and his business partners Yuya and Anna Inaba have crafted their own recipes.

Products include Red Barn pure and garlic vodkas, Country Stone white, spiced, and chai ruhms, and Top of the Morning coffee liquor. The sampling room allows guests to taste before they buy. Products can be purchased from Country Stone, and will soon be on liquor store shelves.

Intensity VR

In addition to the distillery, Dwayne and his wife Shelley MacDonald expanded On Par Golf to include Intensity VR, opening soon at #144, 485 South Avenue. This family-friendly, licensed gaming centre occupies 3,500 SF and offers a full menu, multipurpose party room, and plenty of parking.

Intensity VR, a virtual reality gaming space, will offer individual rooms equipped with Valve Index headsets and a free roam space equipped with Oculus Quest 2 headsets. Virtual escape rooms add even more family fun and entertainment. On Par Golf features simulated golf courses from around the world, with one offering hockey, soccer, bowling, laser shooting and more.

Tourism & Hospitality Recovery Program



The Government of Canada is providing support to businesses in the tourism and hospitality industry through the wage and rent subsidy programs, including hotels, travel agencies, restaurants, and others with a subsidy rate of up to 75%.

<u>Canada Worker</u> Lockdown Benefit



This benefit includes workers in regions where provincial or territorial governments have introduced capacity-limiting restrictions of 50% or more. This benefit is available from October 24, 2021, to May 7, 2022.

Alberta Jobs Now Program



Private and non profit businesses can apply for funding to offset the cost of hiring and training

Hardest-Hit Business Recovery Program



The Government of Canada is providing support for businesses and organizations that are not in the tourism and hospitality industry, this recovery program provides support for businesses that have faced deep losses, with a subsidy rate of up to 50%.

Canada Jobs and Growth Fund (JGF)



A \$700M program that supports regional job creation and positions local economies for long-term growth, including \$70M towards businesses and organizations created after January 2020 for those that meet the eligibility criteria.

Canada-AB Job Grant & Work Sharing Program



The Canada Alberta Job Grant offers funding for training opportunities. The Work Sharing Program

Canada Local Lockdown Program



Wage and rent support extended for businesses and includes employers subject to capacity-limiting restrictions of 50% or more and reduce current-month revenue decline threshold requirements to 25%.

Available from October 24, 2021, to May 7, 2022.

Canada Tourism Relief Fund (TRF)



Funding to help tourism, not-for-profit, and Indigenous businesses adapt their operations to meet public health requirements while investing in products and services to facilitate their future growth.

Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA)



The repayment deadline for Canada Emergency
Business Account loans to

unemployed or underemployed Albertans. The third intake will be announced at a later date. provides EI benefits for employees who share work while their employer recovers. qualify for partial loan forgiveness is being extended to December 31, 2023 for eligible borrowers in good standing.
