

MIDWEST PIPELINES INC.







<u>Midwest Pipelines Inc.</u>, leaders in pipeline technology, established their corporate offices in the Tri-Wellness Building, a 3-storey state of the art modern office and professional building located at 7 Tri-Leisure Way in Spruce Grove. They occupy 7,200 SF of space on the third floor to accommodate approximately 20 staff members.

"In Spruce Grove, we get the work, and then get the work done! This is very much an operational office. The work we do here supports all of the work being done within the company. Everything from managing our equipment - to managing our projects!" - Darrel Ziehr, President

In addition to their corporate offices, Midwest Pipelines has a 28 AC equipment maintenance facility and yard in the Spruce Grove Industrial Park with 15 full-time staff, including mechanics, welders, and transportation logistics.

Midwest is a privately-owned Alberta company with 25% of the company being owned by its employees. Midwest is the only contractor solely owned by Albertans working on the Trans Mountain pipeline expansion. Midwest has been involved in the project for almost 2 years with over 900 employees working on the project.

Work will start in the Stony Plain and Spruce Grove areas in August and will continue into the fall and winter with the Alberta section of the pipeline-scheduled to be completed in fall 2022.

COVID-19 Resources



Our business community has been significantly impacted by the most recent COVID-19 measures implemented by the Alberta Government. The *City of Spruce Grove* maintains an up-to-date database of <u>relevant support programs</u> as well as <u>COVID-19</u> FAQs for businesses.

☐ COVID-19 SUPPORT PROGRAMS ☐

Federal Budget extends several key COVID-19 support programs to Fall 2021.

NEW: Alberta Jobs Now Program



NEW: Highly Affected Sectors Credit Availability Program (HASCAP)



Private and non-profit businesses can apply for funding to offset the cost of hiring and training unemployed or underemployed Albertans into new or vacant full-time jobs. Applications for the first intake will close on August 31, 2021.

This program provides businesses heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to access low-interest loans of \$25,000 to \$1,000,000 to cover cash flow needs. Applications will remain open until June 30, 2021.

EXPANDED: Small and Medium Enterprise Relaunch Grant



Businesses operating since February 29, 2020 and those that began between March 1, 2020 - March 31, 2021 can apply for

NEW: Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS)



Commercial rent and mortgage support to organizations. Lockdown Support provides an additional 25% of support or

up to \$10,000. Hotels, taxis, and rideshare services can now apply.
Applications will remain open until May 31, 2021.

NEW: Alberta's Innovation Employment Grant



Provides up to a 20% tax credit towards R&D. The grant will be phased out for firms with \$10M to \$50M in taxable capital and will provide benefits up to \$4M in annual R&D spending. Delivered through the corporate tax system.

EXPANDED: Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA)



In addition to the \$40,000 interest-free loan, eligible businesses impacted by COVID-19 can access an additional interest-free loan of up to \$20,000. Applicants have until June 30, 2021 to apply for the \$60,000 loan or the \$20,000 expansion.

EXPANDED: Employment Insurance
Program (EI)

90% to businesses greatly impacted. Renters and owners can receive payment without participation of landlords. The deadline is September 25, 2021.

EXPANDED: Regional Relief and Recovery Fund (RRRF)



The RRRF has expanded and now offers up to an additional \$20,000 for eligible small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) needing continued financial support. Deadline extended to June 30, 2021.

EXPANDED: Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS)



An employer who has seen a drop in revenue may be eligible for a subsidy to cover part of employee wages. Changes allow a top-up of 35% and a subsidy amount of \$595 for employees on leave with pay. Deadline extended to September 25, 2021.

EXPANDED: Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB)



CERB has transitioned to EI. The number of weeks of EI benefits is proposed to be increased to a maximum of 50 weeks for claims made between September 27, 2020 September 27, 2020

EXPANDED: Canada's Work Sharing Program

and September 25, 2021.



Extended from 38 to 76 weeks, eligible employers may immediately enter into a new agreement. Eligibility has expanded to include businesses who have been in business for 1 year and essential staff.



Those not eligible for EI can apply through CRB. This allows recipients to apply for 38 weeks between September 27, 2020 and September 25, 2021.

EXPANDED: Canada-Alberta Job Grant



Funding to help employees and unemployed Albertans access training opportunities. Employers to contribute 1/3 of costs and government contributes 2/3 to a maximum of \$10K/year/trainee.
