ALBERTA'S RELAUNCH STRATEGY: STAGE 2 - CHANGES TO COVID-19 SUPPORT PROGRAMS

The *Government of Alberta*'s "<u>Opening Soon - Alberta's Relaunch Strategy</u>" reflects which businesses re-opened during Stage 2 and what public health measures must be followed. Alberta Biz Connect offers <u>relaunch workplace guidance</u> to help businesses reopen and operate safely.

→ <u>Changes to the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)</u> - The CERB application process is closed. Eligible individuals enrolled in this program will transition to one of the following:

- **Employment Insurance (EI)** Individuals have transitioned from CERB to EI for the purpose of providing income support to those who remain unable to work and are eligible, while introducing a new suite of temporary and taxable recovery benefits to further support workers.
- <u>Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB)</u> Individuals not eligible for EI, mainly those that are self-employed and those working in the gig economy, can apply for income support through the CRB program. Individuals can receive \$1,000 (\$900 after taxes withheld) for a 2-week period and may apply up to a total of 13 eligibility periods (26 weeks) between September 27, 2020 and September 25, 2021. Details about how you can apply will be available on October 12, 2020.
- → **<u>NEW: Innovation Employment Grant</u>** The *Government of Alberta* is launching

this grant on January 1, 2021, whereby companies can receive up to 20% towards qualifying research and development expenditures. More details will follow once legislation is introduced in the fall of 2020.

→ <u>EXTENDED: Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS)</u> - Extended to summer 2021. Applications for period 7 are open. Under the extended program, businesses with revenue decline can apply. Employers with a 3-month average revenue drop of more than 50% will receive a top-up rate equal to 1.25x the average revenue drop that exceeds 50%. This is up to a maximum top-up rate of 25%, which is attained at a 70% revenue decline.

→<u>EXTENDED: Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA)</u> - Canada has extended the CEBA application program to October 31, 2020 for businesses and non-profits impacted by COVID-19 to access interest-free loans of up to \$40,000. This program will be expanded to help businesses with fixed costs.

→ <u>EXTENDED: Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance (CECRA)</u> - Those who qualified on the existing program parameters can opt-in by October 30. Both existing and new applicants can apply. Only commercial property owners are able to submit an application.

→ <u>Alberta Small and Medium Enterprise Relaunch Grant</u> - Small and medium-sized businesses, co-ops and non-profits can apply for funding of up to \$5,000 to help open doors and have employees return back to work. These funds help businesses purchase non-medical Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and other supplies, and pay wages and rent. Applications will remain open for 4 weeks following the start of Stage 3 of Alberta's Relaunch Strategy.

→ Invest Alberta Corporation Appoints Chief Executive Officer - Dr. David Knight has been appointed as the Legg as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of *Invest Alberta Corporation*. Previously, he was the Principal Advisor to the Premier of Alberta, where his focus was on capital markets, investment, tax, sector diversification, and Indigenous equity participation. Invest Alberta is intended to provide high-end tailored support to investors and major new investment projects.

→ <u>Business Awards of Distinction</u> - The *Greater Parkland Regional Chamber of Commerce* will be celebrating businesses in the Greater Parkland Region of Spruce Grove, Stony Plain, and Parkland County. The awards will be held virtually on October 22. Catch the live stream on their Facebook page and YouTube channel.
